

Ordinance No. 1022

AN ORDINANCE appropriating a sum of money to defray the expense of acquiring the property known as 106 South St. Asaph Street in the City of Alexandria, Virginia.

WHEREAS, the City has acquired parking lots at 108 to 114 inclusive South St. Asaph Street;

WHEREAS, party wall problems were found to exist between 108 and 106 South St. Asaph Street;

WHEREAS, a determination of the party wall problem would be prolonged by litigation to the detriment of the public health, safety and welfare because there is a pressing need for off-street parking lots in the City;

WHEREAS, the owner of 106 South St. Asaph Street is willing to sell that property to the City at a fair price;

WHEREAS, because of such need, the council authorized the City Manager to enter into a contract to purchase 106 South St. Asaph Street, which contract has been executed;

WHEREAS, there is available to the City the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) unencumbered and unappropriated;

THE CITY COUNCIL OF ALEXANDRIA HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) be and the same hereby is, appropriated and allotted for the purchase of the property known as 106 South St. Asaph Street, Alexandria, Virginia, from Milton R. Greenland and Viola B. Greenland, his wife.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the City not later than five (5) days following its introduction together with a notice containing the time and place for a public hearing. The Clerk of the Council shall note the date of introduction and first reading, the date of publication, the date of the public hearing, and the date of the second reading and final passage in the minutes of the meeting. This ordinance shall become effective the date of its final passage.
