

Ordinance No. 1205

AN ORDINANCE to vacate portions of George Lane and Wilkes Lane, two unopened public streets in the City of Alexandria, Virginia.

WHEREAS, the City Planning Commission has approved the vacation of the portions of the hereinafter described public streets, and

WHEREAS, the viewers appointed by the City have recommended the vacation of the said portion of the two public streets, and

WHEREAS, the procedures required by law for such vacations have been followed, and

WHEREAS, the Council is of the opinion that the hereinafter described portions of the two public streets known as George Lane and Wilkes Lane are no longer required for public use and it is in the best interest to abandon them; now therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF ALEXANDRIA HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That the hereinafter described portions of the two public streets, known as George Lane and Wilkes Lane, be, and the same hereby are, vacated and abandoned:

A. All of that portion of George Lane beginning at a line which runs parallel with Duke Street and which line lies approximately 307 feet southerly from Duke Street, running from said line in a southwesterly direction approximately 465 feet, as shown on Alexandria City 1958 Assessment Map No. 101, Block 1, and as shown also on the plat bearing date of January 11, 1963, on file in the office of the City Clerk of the City of Alexandria, Virginia.

B. All of that portion of Wilkes Lane running in a northwesterly direction from the west line of Holland Lane for a distance of approximately 300 feet, as shown on Alexandria City 1958 Assessment Map No. 101, Block 1, and as shown also on the plat bearing date of January 11, 1963, on file in the office of the City Clerk of the City of Alexandria, Virginia.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the City not later than five days following its introduction together with a notice containing the time and place for a public hearing. The Clerk of the Council shall note the date of introduction and first reading, the date of publication, the date of the public hearing, and the date of the second reading and final passage in the minutes of the meeting. This ordinance shall become effective the date of its final passage.
