

AN ORDINANCE to amend Section 22-61, Division 1, Article III, Chapter 22 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1963, as amended, by adding thereto a new paragraph; which Chapter 22 relates to MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC, which Article III relates to OPERATION OF VEHICLES, which Division I relates to IN GENERAL, which Section 22-61 relates to DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED OR REVOKED, and which new paragraph relates to FURTHER PENALTIES.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF ALEXANDRIA HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That Section 22-61, Division 1, Article III, Chapter 22 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1963, as amended, be and the same hereby is amended by adding thereto a new paragraph to read as follows:

In addition, the court shall suspend or revoke such person's license, permit or privilege to drive for the same period for which it had been previously suspended or revoked when such person violated this section. In the event such person has violated this section by driving during a period of suspension or revocation which was not for a definite period of time, the court shall suspend or revoke such person's license, permit or privilege to drive for an additional period not to exceed ninety days. Any additional suspension ordered under the provisions of this section shall commence upon the expiration of the previous suspension or revocation unless such previous suspension or revocation has expired prior to the ordering of an additional suspension or revocation.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the city not later than five days following its introduction together with a notice containing the time and place for a public hearing. The Clerk of the Council shall note the date of introduction and first reading, the date of publication, the date of the public hearing, and the date of the second reading and final passage in the minutes of the meeting. This ordinance shall become effective the date of its final passage.
