

AN ORDINANCE to repeal Ordinance Number 2069, finally passed on December 13, 1975, by the City Council of Alexandria, Virginia, which said ordinance authorized Madison Associates Limited Partnership, the owners of the premises numbered 400 Madison Street, commonly known as the Alexandria House, and their successors in title, to maintain existing encroachments in, upon and over the public rights-of-way in the block bound by North Pitt, Madison, North Royal and Wythe Streets, all of which are public streets of the City of Alexandria, Virginia.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF ALEXANDRIA HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That Ordinance Number 2069, finally passed on December 13, 1975, by the City Council of Alexandria, Virginia, be and the same hereby is repealed.

Section 2. That the title of and an informal memorandum explaining this ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation published in the city not later than five days following its introduction together with a notice containing the time and place for a public hearing. The city clerk shall have the full text of this ordinance printed in sufficient numbers to supply copies to meet request. The city clerk shall note the date of introduction and first reading, the date of publication, the date of the public hearing, and the date of the second reading and final passage in the minutes of the meeting. This ordinance shall become effective the date of its final passage.
