

ORDINANCE NO. 2315

AN ORDINANCE to amend Article II by adding thereto a new section numbered 20-61.1, and to amend and reordain subsection (A), Section 20-74, Article III, all of Chapter 20 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1963, as amended; which Chapter 20 relates to LICENSES, which Article II relates to REGULATORY LICENSES, which new Section 20-61.1 relates to MASSAGE PARLOR OPERATORS, which Article III relates to NONREGULATORY LICENSES, which Section 20-74 relates to PERSONAL SERVICES and which subsection (a) relates to THE OPERATING OF CERTAIN BUSINESSES.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF ALEXANDRIA HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That Article II, Chapter 20 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1963, as amended, be and the same hereby is amended by adding thereto a new section numbered 20-61.1 to read as follows:

Sec. 20-61.1. Massage parlor operators.

Every person operating a massage parlor, as defined by section 20A-1 of this Code, in the city shall pay for the privilege and annual license tax of \$5,000.00. Before any license under this section shall be issued by the director of finance, the applicant shall produce evidence that he has obtained a permit under the provisions of section 20A-4 of this Code. The license tax imposed herein shall be required as of January 1, 1979.

Section 2. That subsection (A), Section 20-74, Article III, Chapter 20 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1963, as amended, be and the same hereby is amended and reordained to read as follows:

(A) The business of operating:

- Barbershops.
- Beauty parlors.
- Chartered clubs.
- Convalescent homes (except nonprofit corporations).
- Hair dressing establishments.
- Hotels, motels, and motor hotels.
- Information bureaus or booths.
- Nursing homes (except nonprofit corporations).
- Old age homes (except nonprofit corporations).
- Private hospitals (except nonprofit corporations).

Section 3. That the title of and an informal memorandum explaining this ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation published in the city not later than five days following its introduction together with a notice containing the time and place for a public hearing. The city clerk shall have the full text of this ordinance printed in sufficient numbers to supply copies to meet request. The city clerk shall note the date of introduction and first reading, the date of publication, the date of the public hearing, and the date of the second reading and final passage in the minutes of the meeting. This ordinance shall become effective the date of its final passage.
