

RELATING TO NORTHERN VIRGINIA REGIONAL
PARK AUTHORITY
FEDERAL OPEN SPACE GRANT

WHEREAS, the Northern Virginia Regional Park Authority has acquired the property known as the Carlyle House and the Carlyle Apartments for the purpose of creating a historic park; and

WHEREAS, the development of a historic park for public use is in accordance with and supplementary to the urban redevelopment program of the City of Alexandria; and


WHEREAS, the plans of the Northern Virginia Regional Park Authority include the creation of open space by the removal of that portion of the building known as the Carlyle Apartments which was erected as an addition to the structure on the southeast corner of Cameron and Fairfax Streets which was built as the Bank of Alexandria; and

WHEREAS, the Carlyle House is a uniquely important historical structure; and

WHEREAS, the proposed open space will improve the public view from Fairfax Street and provide a setting befitting a structure of such important historic character;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, that the actions of the Northern Virginia Regional Park Authority are in conformity with the plans of the City of Alexandria.
