

RESOLUTION NO. 123

WHEREAS, Alexandria was alerted to a possible flood condition on Wednesday, June 21, 1972; and

WHEREAS, City employees immediately began preparations for responding to such a flood; and

WHEREAS, through the responsive and unselfish cooperation of an array of private agencies, the City and her people were substantially assisted in reacting to flood conditions which did occur; and

WHEREAS, through the prompt, efficient, and tireless efforts of the employees of the City, loss of life and damage to property were held to a minimum; and

WHEREAS, through their effective action and devotion to duty-- all consistent with the highest ideals of public service--City employees, the employees of private agencies, and private citizens alike, have brought great credit to our City and to themselves;
