

RESOLUTION NO. 419

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Alexandria is advised that the Virginia Council on Criminal Justice has recently indicated, by reducing funding, that the High Incidence Target Program in Alexandria, and in other localities, will end on or about December 31, 1975.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Alexandria is of the opinion that HIT Programs utilizing concentrated public education efforts and various basic police techniques, have the potential of effectively contributing to a reduction in the level of crime in this City, as well as in other jurisdictions.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Alexandria supports the concept of HIT as a crime-fighting method, and strongly urges the Virginia Council on Criminal Justice to continue funding of the Alexandria High Incidence Target Program at least until June 30, 1976 in order that said program can be more fully evaluated.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a representative of the City present copies of this resolution to members of the Council on Criminal Justice at its meeting in Richmond, Virginia on September 12, 1975.
