

ORDINANCE NO 111.

AN ORDINANCE to Vacate and Close Franklin Street from the East Side of Union Street Eastwardly to the Potomac River, and the Strand, from the South Side of Wolfe Street, Southwardly to the Southern Corporate Limits, as Public Streets.

WHEREAS, in certain conveyances of land by the then owners thereof in years past it was provided that Franklin Street should be extended at a width of fifty feet from the east side of Union Street to the Potomac River, but same has never been opened nor utilized as a public street, and

WHEREAS, in certain conveyances of land by the then owners thereof in years past, boundaries of lands conveyed indicated an intention by the then owners to extend the street known as The Strand at various points south of the south side of Wolfe Street, but same has never been opened nor utilized as a public street, and

WHEREAS, in the comprehensive City plan now being formulated by the City Council of Alexandria, it is proposed to open and extend such streets and highways as the public convenience and necessity requires, and to vacate and close such dedicated or otherwise provided for streets, alleys and highways, as are not used nor useful for such purposes,

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF ALEXANDRIA, VIRGINIA

SECTION 1. That Franklin Street, from the east side of Union Street, eastwardly to the Potomac River, be, and the same is hereby vacated and closed as a public street or thoroughfare.

SECTION 2. That the street known as The Strand, from the south side of Wolfe Street, southwardly to the southern corporate limits be, and the same is hereby vacated and closed as a public street or thoroughfare.

SECTION 3. That this ordinance be recorded among the land records of the City of Alexandria, appropriately indexed in the name of the City Council of Alexandria and the streets affected hereby.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage.
