

ORDINANCE NO. 116

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 109 of the City Council of Alexandria, Virginia, approved July 25th, 1931, being an Ordinance entitled: "An Ordinance to regulate and restrict the location of buildings and structures and of premises to be used for trade, industry, residence or other specified uses within the City of Alexandria; to divide the City into zones, and to impose in each of said zones regulations designating the kinds or classes of trades, industries, residences or other purposes for which buildings or other structures or premises may be erected, altered or used; and to regulate the height, bulk and location of buildings and other structures and the areas of yards and open spaces."

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of Alexandria, Virginia:

Section 1. That the Zoning Map described and referred to in Section 2 of Ordinance No. 109 of the City Council of Alexandria, Virginia, be changed and amended in the following particulars, to-wit:

A. That all of the area in the square bounded by Franklin, Jefferson, Washington and Columbus Streets, except that strip of land fronting on Washington Street between Franklin and Jefferson Streets with a depth westwardly from the west side of Washington Street of 31 feet, and also that strip of land fronting on Columbus Street between Franklin and Jefferson Streets with a depth eastwardly from the east side of Columbus Street of 59 feet 10 inches, be changed from the present classification of "A" Residence Zone and "B" Residence Zone to "D" Commercial Zone.

B. That the area of frontage on the south side of Hume Avenue between Mount Vernon and DeWitt Avenues with a depth of 120 feet be changed from "A" Residence Zone to "B" Residence Zone.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its passage.
