

## ORDINANCE NO. 123

AN ORDINANCE to amend and re-enact Section 2 of Ordinance No. 120 of the City Council of Alexandria, approved July 21st, 1932 Being 'An Ordinance to provide for City Planning, including Park Development and Maintenance; the Creation, Organization and Powers of the Park and Planning Commission; the regulation of Subdivision of land and the establishment of street grades; the establishment of building lines and the acquisition of right to keep planned streets free from buildings; and providing penalties for violation of this ordinance.'

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALEXANDRIA, VIRGINIA:

SECTION 1. That Section 2 of Ordinance No. 120 of the City Council of Alexandria, Virginia, approved July 21, 1932, be amended and re-enacted to read as follows:

"Section 2. The Commission. For the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this ordinance, namely, to make, adopt, amend, extend, add to and carry out a city plan, a commission shall be appointed, provided however, that from the date of the passage of this ordinance until October 1st, 1932, and until their successors shall have been duly elected as hereinafter provided, and qualified, the Commission shall consist of the members heretofore appointed by the Corporation Court as the Zoning Commission, namely, George E. Garrett, N. J. Lawler, R. L. Kane, John U. Reardon and B. B. Ezrine, said members of the Zoning Commission having, by authority of Resolution heretofore adopted by the Council, made comprehensive surveys and studies with the view of recommending a master plan for the physical development of the City, and they are hereby authorized and directed to utilize all materials and data heretofore compiled and assembled in carrying into effect the provisions of this ordinance.

On and after October 1st, 1932, the Commission shall consist of five members, who shall be elected by the Council, and who shall serve as such without compensation. The terms of the members shall be for one two, three, four and five years, or until their successors take office. Members may, after a public hearing, be removed by the Council for inefficiency, neglect of duty, or malfeasance in office. The Council shall file a written statement of reasons for such removal. Vacancies shall be filled by the Council."

SECTION 2. The ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its passage.
