

ORDINANCE NO 203

An Ordinance to repeal and re-enact Paragraph A-7 of Section VI of Ordinance No. 109 of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, approved July 25th, 1931, as amended, same being an Ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance to regulate and restrict the location of buildings and structures and of premises to be used for trade, industry, residence or other specified uses within the City of Alexandria; to divide the City into zones, and to impose in each of said zones regulations designating the kinds or classes or trades, industries, residences or other purposes for which buildings or other structures or premises may be erected, altered or used; and to regulate the height, bulk and location of buildings and other structures and the areas of yards and open spaces."

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Alexandria, Virginia:

Section 1. That Paragraph A-7 of Section VI of Ordinance No. 109 of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, approved July 25th, 1931, as amended by Ordinance No. 162 approved November 7, 1934, and Ordinance No. 166, approved November 7, 1934, be repealed and re-enacted to read as follows:

"A-7. Sign, advertising only the general business conducted on the premises and not projecting more than three (3) feet beyond the wall of the building upon which placed. Signs may be placed or painted on only the front wall of the building, except a corner building in which case the side of the building facing the intersecting street shall also be defined as frontage. No sign or signs shall have a larger area in the aggregate than one-tenth of the area of the said front wall of the building.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its passage.
