

ORDINANCE NO. 213

AN ORDINANCE to regulate the lighting of commercial establishments conducted on open yards, lots or other uncovered and unenclosed areas, when located adjacent to property used for residential purposes.

Be It Ordained by the Council of the City of Alexandria, Virginia:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for the operator of any commercial establishment conducted upon open yards, lots or other uncovered and unenclosed areas when located adjacent to property used for residential purposes, to use for the lighting of such establishments lamps of more than 100 candle power and such lamps shall be not more than four in number and so arranged and deflected as to be focused upon and within the area of the property so occupied and so that the illumination therefrom shall not be thrown upon the adjacent property occupied for residential purposes.

Section 2. Any violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be punishable by a fine of not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$100.00, and each day's continuance of any violation of this ordinance shall constitute a separate offense.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect on the 15th day from date of passage of ordinance.
