

AN ORDINANCE to amend and reordain Section 22-202 of Article VIII of Chapter 22 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1963, as amended; which Chapter 22 relates to MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC; which Article VIII relates to BRAKES, HORNS AND OTHER MECHANICAL EQUIPMENT, and which Section 22-202 relates to CLEATS, ETC., ON TIRES; CHAINS; TIRES WITH STUDS.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF ALEXANDRIA HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That Section 22-202 of Article VIII of Chapter 22 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1963, as amended, be and the same hereby is amended and reordained to read as follows:

Sec. 22-202. Cleats, etc., on tires; chains; tires with studs.

No tire on a vehicle moved on a * street shall have on its periphery any block, stud, flange, cleat or spike or any other protuberance of any material other than rubber which projects beyond the tread of the traction surface of the tire; except, that it shall be permissible to use farm machinery having protuberances which will not injure the street and to use tire chains of reasonable proportions when required for safety because of snow, ice or other conditions tending to cause a vehicle to slide or skid. It shall also be permissible to use upon any vehicle, whose gross weight does not exceed ten thousand pounds, tires with studs which project not more than one sixteenth of an inch beyond the tread of the traction surface of the tire when compressed and which cover not more than three percent of the traction surface of the tire. The use of such studded tires shall be permissible until April 15, 1968, from October 15, 1968 to April 15, 1969 and from October 15, 1969 to April 15, 1970.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the city not later than five days following its introduction together with a notice containing the time and place for a public hearing. The Clerk of the Council shall note the date of introduction and first reading, the date of publication, the date of the public hearing, and the date of the second reading and final passage in the minutes of the meeting. This ordinance shall become effective the date of its final passage.
