

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE to amend subsection (a), Section 42-17, Article III, Chapter 42 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1963, as amended, by adding thereto a new subsection numbered (38); which Chapter 42 relates to ZONING, which Article III relates to USE, AREA, etc., REGULATIONS GENERALLY, which Section 42-17 relates to C-2 COMMERCIAL ZONE, which subsection (a) relates to USES PERMITTED and which subsection (38) relates to WHOLESALE BUSINESSES.

WHEREAS, pursuant to due and timely notice of the time and place of hearing published in a daily paper of general circulation published in the City of Alexandria, Virginia, a public hearing was held in relation to the matters hereinafter set forth, at which public hearing parties in interest and citizens had an opportunity to be heard.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF ALEXANDRIA HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That subsection (a), Section 42-17, Article III, Chapter 42 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1963, as amended; be and the same hereby is amended by adding thereto a new subsection numbered (38) to read as follows:

(38) Wholesale businesses (permitted only with a special use permit as specified in Sections 42-68 to 42-71 of this Code).

Section 2. That in the opinion of City Council an emergency exists and this ordinance is hereby declared an EMERGENCY ORDINANCE so that the City can immediately seek to encourage compatible, quality wholesale operations to locate in certain business zones in the City.

Section 3. That this EMERGENCY ORDINANCE shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the City not later than five days following its introduction together with a notice containing the time and place for a public hearing. The Clerk of the Council shall note the date of introduction and first reading, the date of publication, the date of the public hearing, and the date of the second reading and final passage in the minutes of the meeting. This ordinance shall become effective the date of its final passage.
