

AN ORDINANCE to amend and reordain subsection (a) of Section 22-8, Article I, Chapter 22 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1963, as amended; which Chapter 22 relates to MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC, which Article I relates to IN GENERAL, which Section 22-8 relates to DUTY OF DRIVER TO STOP, RENDER AID, GIVE INFORMATION, ETC., IN EVENT OF ACCIDENT; DUTY OF WITNESS, ETC., and which subsection (a) thereof relates to DUTY OF DRIVER.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF ALEXANDRIA HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That subsection (a) of Section 22-8, Article I, Chapter 22 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1963, as amended, be and the same hereby is amended and reordained to read as follows:

(a) The driver of any vehicle involved in an accident in which a person is killed or injured or in which an attended vehicle or other attended property is damaged shall immediately stop as close to the scene of the accident as possible without obstructing traffic and report * forthwith to the police authority; and, in addition, to the person struck and injured if such person appears to be capable of understanding and retaining information, or to the driver or some other occupant of the vehicle collided with or to the custodian of other damaged property, his name, address, operator's or chauffeur's license number and the registration number of his vehicle. The driver shall also render reasonable assistance to any person injured in such accident, including the carrying of such injured person to a physician, surgeon or hospital for medical treatment if it is apparent that such treatment is necessary or is requested by the injured person.

Section 2. That this ORDINANCE shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the city not later than five days following its introduction together with a notice containing the time and place for a public hearing. The clerk of the council shall note the date of introduction and first reading, the date of publication, the date of the public hearing, and the date of the second reading and final passage in the minutes of the meeting. This ordinance shall become effective June 26, 1970.
