

AN ORDINANCE to amend and reordain Section 22-194, Article VIII, Chapter 22 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1963, as amended; which Chapter 22 relates to MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC, which Article VIII relates to BRAKES, HORNS AND OTHER MECHANICAL EQUIPMENT, and which Section 22-194 relates to WARNING DEVICES--ILLEGAL POSSESSION OR SALE OF UNAPPROVED EQUIPMENT.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF ALEXANDRIA HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That Section 22-194, Article VIII, Chapter 22 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1963, as amended, be and the same hereby is amended and reordained to read as follows:

Sec. 22-194. Warning devices--Illegal possession or sale of * unapproved equipment.

It shall be unlawful to possess with intent to sell or to sell or offer for sale,* either separately or as a part of the equipment of a motor vehicle, or to use or have as equipment upon a motor vehicle operated on a highway any lighting device, warning device, signal device, safety glass or other equipment on which approval is required or any part or parts tending to change or alter the operation of such device, glass or other equipment unless of a type that has been approved by the superintendent of the department of state police, or meets or exceeds the standards and specifications of the Society of Automotive Engineers, the American National Standards Institute, Incorporated or the federal department of transportation.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the city not later than five days following its introduction together with a notice containing the time and place for a public hearing. The clerk of the council shall note the date of introduction and first reading, the date of publication, the date of the public hearing, and the date of the second reading and final passage in the minutes of the meeting. This ordinance shall become effective June 26, 1970.
