

AN ORDINANCE to vacate a 10-foot wide walkway and water easement running between North Lindsay Place and Knox Place in the Belle-Wood and Varsity Park subdivisions of the City of Alexandria, Virginia.

WHEREAS, said vacation has been approved by the Planning Commission at one of its regular meetings; and

WHEREAS, the procedures required by law have been followed, including the posting of notice to the land proprietors affected; and

WHEREAS, viewers were duly appointed by the Council of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, and have made their report; and

WHEREAS, in consideration of the report of the said viewers recommending said vacation, and of other evidence relative thereto, it is the opinion of the Council of the City of Alexandria, Virginia that the walkway and water easement above mentioned and hereinafter described in Belle-Wood and Varsity Park subdivisions is not needed for public use, and that it is in the public interest to vacate the same; therefore

THE CITY COUNCIL OF ALEXANDRIA HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That the hereinafter described walkway and water easement between North Lindsay Place and Knox Place in the Belle-Wood and Varsity Park subdivisions of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, be and the same hereby is vacated and abandoned.

All of the walkway and water easement lying on lot 82, section 8, Belle-Wood subdivision, as the same is shown on a plat recorded in Deed Book 613, at page 469, among the land records of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, which said walkway and water easement is 10 feet wide and approximately 181 feet long, and all of the walkway and water easement lying on lots 53 and 54, section 8, Varsity Park subdivision, as the same is shown on a plat recorded in Deed Book 582, at page 344, among the land records of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, which said walkway and water easement is 10 feet wide and 186.10 feet long, the whole running approximately 367 feet from the west line of North Lindsay Place to the east line of Knox Place.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the city not later than five days following its introduction together with a notice containing the time and place for a public hearing. The clerk of the council shall note the date of introduction and first reading, the date of publication, the date of the public hearing, and the date of the second reading and final passage in the minutes of the meeting. This ordinance shall become effective the date of its final passage.
