

ORDINANCE NO. 1946

AN ORDINANCE to vacate a portion of Cameron Street, being a 30 foot wide public street in the City of Alexandria, Virginia, extending from South Quaker Lane in a westerly direction for a distance of 427.90 feet.

WHEREAS, the said vacation has been approved by the planning commission at one of its regular meetings; and

WHEREAS, the procedures required by law, including the posting of notice to the land proprietors affected, have been followed; and

WHEREAS, viewers were duly appointed by the council of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, and have made their report; and

WHEREAS, in consideration of the report of said viewers recommending the said vacation, and of other evidence relative thereto, it is the opinion of the council of the City of Alexandria, Virginia that the portion of Cameron Street extending for a distance of 427.90 feet in a westerly direction from South Quaker Lane is not needed for public use and that it is in the public interest to vacate it; therefore

THE CITY COUNCIL OF ALEXANDRIA HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That the hereinafter described portion of Cameron Street in the City of Alexandria, Virginia, be and the same hereby is vacated and abandoned:

Beginning at the point of intersection of the northerly line of Cameron Street and the westerly line of South Quaker Lane, as the same are duly dedicated, platted and recorded in Deed Book X-9 at page 55, among the Fairfax County, Virginia land records; thence along the westerly line of South Quaker Lane S. 05° 06' 00" W., 30.00 feet to the southerly line of Cameron Street; thence along the southerly line of Cameron Street N. 84° 54' 00" W., 427.90 feet; thence N. 05° 06' 00" E., 30.00 feet to the northerly line of Cameron Street; thence along the northerly line of Cameron Street S. 84° 54' 00" E., 427.90 feet to the point of beginning, containing 12,837 square feet.

Section 2. That the title of and an informal memorandum explaining this ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation published in the city not later than five days following its introduction together with a notice containing the time and place for a public hearing. The city clerk shall have the full text of this ordinance printed in sufficient numbers to supply copies to meet request. The city clerk shall note the date of introduction and first

reading, the date of publication, the date of the public hearing, and the date of the second reading and final passage in the minutes of the meeting. This ordinance shall be deemed to be passed on the date of its final passage, but shall not be effective until the date a certified copy is recorded as deeds are recorded. Such recordation shall be indexed in the name of the City of Alexandria, but shall be done by the applicant, at his own expense.
