

ORDINANCE NO. 1971

AN ORDINANCE to amend and reordain Sections 20-6, 20-18 and 20-20, Article I, and Sections 20-73, 20-74 and 20-75, Article III, all of Chapter 20 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1963, as amended; which Chapter 20 relates to LICENSES, which Article I relates to licenses IN GENERAL, which Section 20-6 relates to SEPARATE LICENSE FOR EACH PLACE OF BUSINESS; EXCEPTION, which Section 20-18 relates to MINIMUM WHEN TAX IS BASED ON GROSS RECEIPTS, which Section 20-20 relates to DISPLAY, which Article III relates to NONREGULATORY LICENSES, which Section 20-73 relates to PROFESSIONAL OCCUPATIONS AND BUSINESSES, which Section 20-74 relates to PERSONAL SERVICES, and which Section 20-75 relates to BUSINESS SERVICES AND OCCUPATIONS.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF ALEXANDRIA HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That Section 20-6, Article I, Chapter 20 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1963, as amended, be and the same hereby is amended and reordained to read as follows:

Sec. 20-6. Separate license for each place of business and for two or more occupations conducted at the same place of business.

No license shall be issued under the provisions of sections 20-37 to 20-72 and section 20-118 of this Code, relative to regulatory licenses and sections 20-73 to 20-87 and section 20-89 of this Code, relative to nonregulatory licenses, to cover more than one place of business. A separate license shall be obtained for each business, profession, trade or occupation for which a license is required under the provisions of sections 20-37 to 20-89, 20-99, 20-103 and 20-118 for the privilege of engaging in same, even though two or more of such businesses, professions, trades or occupations may be conducted by the same or separate applicants at the same location.

Section 2. That Section 20-18, Article I, Chapter 20 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1963, as amended, be and the same hereby is amended and reordained to read as follows:

Sec. 20-18. Minimum when tax is based on gross receipts.

The minimum license tax on licenses issued under the provisions of sections 20-73 to 20-78 and 20-80 to 20-87 of this Code relative to nonregulatory licenses, shall be thirty dollars in cases where the tax is measured by gross receipts. The minimum license tax on licenses issued to wholesale merchants under the provisions of section 20-79 of this Code shall be twenty-five dollars.

Section 3. That Section 20-20, Article I, Chapter 20 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1963, as amended, be and the same hereby is amended and reordained to read as follows:

Sec. 20-20. Display.

Every person required to pay a license tax under the provisions of this chapter shall keep the license, tag, button or sign issued in evidence thereof in a convenient and conspicuous place, and whenever required to do so shall exhibit the same to any authorized enforcement office of the city.

Section 4. That the list of professional occupations and businesses in Section 20-73, Article III, Chapter 20 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1963, as amended, be and the same hereby is amended by inserting the following alphabetically:

Management consultant.
Psychiatrist.

Section 5. That the list of personal services in Section 20-74, Article III, Chapter 20 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1963, as amended, be and the same hereby is amended by inserting the following in subsections (A) and (B) alphabetically:

- (A) Massage parlors.
- (B) Baby sitter registry.
Epilator
Furnishing escort services.
Talent agents.

Section 6. That the list of business services and occupations in Section 20-75, Article III, Chapter 20 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1963, as amended, be and the same hereby is amended by inserting the following alphabetically:

- Carpet installation.
- Drafting services.
- Furnishing janitorial services.
- Motion picture film production and laboratories.

Section 7. That the title of and an informal memorandum explaining this ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation published in the city not later than five days following its introduction together with a notice containing the time and place for a public hearing. The city clerk shall have the full text of this ordinance printed in sufficient numbers to supply copies to meet request. The city clerk shall note the date of introduction and first reading, the date of publication, the date of the public hearing, and the date of the second reading and final passage in the minutes of the meeting. This ordinance shall become effective January 1, 1975.
