

ORDINANCE NO. 2463

AN ORDINANCE to amend and reordain the first paragraph and sub-subsection (2), subsection (d), Section 1-17, Chapter 1 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1963, as amended; which Chapter 1 relates to GENERAL PROVISIONS, which Section 1-17 relates to ESTABLISHMENT OF ELECTION DISTRICTS AND VOTING PLACES, which subsection (d) relates to FOURTH WARD and which subsubsection (2) formerly related to THE BISHOP IRETON SCHOOL ELECTION DISTRICT and now relates to THE SECOND PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH ELECTION DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, an increase of student enrollment at Bishop Ireton School has made that facility no longer available as a voting place; and

WHEREAS, it is therefore imperative that the city relocate the polling place within the Bishop Ireton School Election District as soon as possible; and

WHEREAS, the city is prohibited by section 24.1-40.3 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, from altering the boundaries of any election district without court order until May 31, 1981; and

WHEREAS, the voting place within the Bishop Ireton School Election District must therefore be moved to another location within that district; and

WHEREAS, the most appropriate location for the voting place is the Second Presbyterian Church, due to its accessibility and the availability of the church as a polling place; now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF ALEXANDRIA HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That the first paragraph, subsection (d), Section 1-17, Chapter 1 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1963, as amended, be and the same hereby is amended and reordained to read as follows:

(d) Fourth Ward. MacArthur School Election District and voting place; Second Presbyterian Church Election District and voting place; Lyceum Election District and voting place; Robert E. Lee School Election District and voting place. The fourth ward shall be divided into MacArthur School Election District, Second Presbyterian Church Election District, Lyceum Election District and Robert E. Lee School Election District.

Section 2. That subsubsection (2), subsection (d), Section 1-17, Chapter 1 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1963, as amended, be and the same hereby is amended and reordained to read as follows:

(2) The Second Presbyterian Church Election District shall be bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point where a line fifty (50) feet south of the center line of Janneys Lane and parallel with Janneys Lane intersects with the center line of King Street; thence eastward along the center line of King Street to the western right-of-way of

the Richmond, Fredericksburg and Potomac Railroad; thence westward along the right-of-way line to the center line of South Quaker Lane; thence northward along the center line of South Quaker Lane to the center line of Duke Street; thence westward along the center line of Duke Street to the center line of North Quaker Lane; thence northward along the center line of North Quaker Lane to the line fifty (50) feet south of the center line of Janneys Lane and parallel with Janneys Lane; thence eastward along such line to the point of beginning.

The voting place within the Second Presbyterian Church Election District shall be the Second Presbyterian Church, at 1400 Janneys Lane.

Those persons whose residences abut on the south side of Janneys Lane, but who do not have a Janneys Lane mailing address, are included within the Second Presbyterian Church Election District, even though a portion of their residence may not be within the boundary of that district.

Section 3. That the title of and an informal memorandum explaining this ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation published in the city not later than five days following its introduction together with a notice containing the time and place for a public hearing. The city clerk shall have the full text of this ordinance printed in sufficient numbers to supply copies to meet request. The city clerk shall note the date of introduction and first reading, the date of publication, the date of the public hearing, and the date of the second reading and final passage in the minutes of the meeting. This ordinance shall become effective the date of its final passage.
