

ORDINANCE NO. 2596

AN ORDINANCE to amend and reordain subsections (1) and (1.1), subsection (a), Section 22-152.6, Article V-A, Chapter 22 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1963, as amended; which Chapter 22 relates to MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC, which Article V-A relates to PAYMENT, CONTEST AND ENFORCEMENT OF PARKING CITATIONS, which Section 22-152.6 relates to PENALTIES FOR UNCONTESTED PARKING CITATIONS, which subsection (a) relates to IF PAYMENT IS TENDERED WITHIN THIRTY CALENDAR DAYS FROM THE DATE THE CITATION IS ISSUED, which subsection (1) relates to VIOLATION OF SECTION 22-98 and which subsection (1.1) relates to VIOLATION OF SECTION 22-98.1.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF ALEXANDRIA HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That subsection (1), subsection (a), Section 22-152.6, Article V-A, Chapter 22 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1963, as amended, be and the same hereby is amended and reordained to read as follows:

(1) Ten dollars (\$10.00) for a violation of section 22-98, "Stopping contrary to directions of police officers."

Section 2. That subsection (1.1), subsection (a), Section 22-152.6, Article V-A, Chapter 22 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1963, as amended, be and the same hereby is amended and reordained to read as follows:

(1.1) Ten dollars (\$10.00) for a violation of section 22-98.1, "Permitting vehicle to remain parked contrary to the directions of an official sign."

Section 3. That the title of and an informal memorandum explaining this ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation published in the city not later than five days following its introduction together with a notice containing the time and place for a public hearing. The city clerk shall have the full text of this ordinance printed in sufficient numbers to supply copies to meet request. The city clerk shall note the date of introduction and first reading, the date of publication, the date of the public hearing, and the date of the second reading and final passage in the minutes of the meeting. This ordinance shall become effective the date of its final passage.
