

ORDINANCE NO. 2668

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the owner of the premises situated at 120 North Saint Asaph Street, and his successors in title, to construct and maintain an encroachment consisting of a third-story addition which will encroach upon and over the public right-of-way of the west side of North Saint Asaph Street in the City of Alexandria, Virginia.

WHEREAS, Mr. Charles H. Smith, Jr. is the owner of the premises situated at 120 North Saint Asaph Street in the City of Alexandria, Virginia; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Charles H. Smith, Jr. desires to construct and maintain a third-story addition which will be in line with the facade of the existing two- (2) story structure and will encroach a maximum of 0.52 feet onto the west side of the public right-of-way of North Saint Asaph Street; and

WHEREAS, the sidewalk area at that point is sufficiently wide for pedestrian traffic; and

WHEREAS, the said encroachment has been approved by the Planning Commission of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, and it has determined that this encroachment is not detrimental to the public interest; therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF ALEXANDRIA HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That Mr. Charles H. Smith, Jr., and his successors in title, be and he hereby is authorized to construct and maintain the above-described third-story addition which will be in line with the facade of the existing two- (2) story structure located at 120 North Saint Asaph Street and will encroach a maximum of 0.52 feet onto the west side of the public right-of-way of North Saint Asaph Street, until such encroachment is removed or destroyed, provided this authority shall not be construed to relieve such owner of any negligence on his part on account of such encroachment and subject to the hereinafter contained provisions.

Section 2. That the privilege hereby granted to construct and maintain the encroachment shall be subject to the maintaining by the owner of the encroachment of public liability and property damage insurance indemnifying the City of Alexandria, such policy to be presented to the city attorney for approval.

Section 3. That the maintenance and use of said encroachment, pursuant to the authority hereby granted, shall be considered an agreement by the owner and his successors and assigns to save harmless the City of Alexandria from any

liability by reason of the use and maintenance of the said encroachment.

Section 4. That the privilege hereby granted to maintain the encroachment, as hereinabove described, shall be terminated whenever the City of Alexandria shall desire to use that portion of the public right-of-way for any purpose whatsoever, and shall by written notification demand from the owner the removal of such encroachment, which removal shall be completed promptly, within no more than 30 days from the date of such notice, without cost to the City of Alexandria.

Section 5. That the title of and an informal memorandum explaining this ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation published in the city not later than five days following its introduction together with a notice containing the time and place for a public hearing. The city clerk shall have the full text of this ordinance printed in sufficient numbers to supply copies to meet request. The city clerk shall note the date of introduction and first reading, the date of publication, the date of the public hearing, and the date of the second reading and final passage in the minutes of the meeting. This ordinance shall become effective the date of its final passage.
