

ORDINANCE NO. 3344

AN ORDINANCE to amend and reordain Section 10-3-266 (DRIVING MOTOR VEHICLE, ENGINE, ETC., WHILE INTOXICATED) and Section 10-3-268 (USE OF CHEMICAL TEST TO DETERMINE ALCOHOLIC CONTENT OF BLOOD; PROCEDURE; QUALIFICATIONS AND LIABILITY OF PERSON WITHDRAWING BLOOD; COSTS; EVIDENCE; SUSPENSION OF LICENSE FOR REFUSAL TO SUBMIT TO TEST; LOCALITIES AUTHORIZED TO ADOPT PARALLEL PROVISIONS) of Article B (RECKLESS DRIVING, SPEEDING, ETC.), Chapter 3 (OPERATION OF VEHICLES), TITLE 10 (MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC) of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1981, as amended.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF ALEXANDRIA HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That Section 10-3-266 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1981, as amended, be and the same hereby is amended and reordained to read as follows:

Sec. 10-3-266 Driving motor vehicle, engine, etc., while intoxicated.

Pursuant to the authority granted by section 46.1-188 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, section 18.2-266 of the Virginia Code, as amended, which relates to driving while intoxicated, is hereby adopted and incorporated in its entirety into this chapter as if it were fully set forth herein.

Section 2. That Section 10-3-268 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1981, as amended, be and the same hereby is amended and reordained to read as follows:

Sec. 10-3-268 Use of chemical test to determine alcoholic content of blood; procedure; qualifications and liability of person withdrawing blood; costs; evidence; suspension of license for refusal to submit to test; localities authorized to adopt parallel provisions.

Pursuant to the authority granted by section 46.1-188 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, section 18.2-268 of the Virginia Code, as amended, which relates use of a chemical test to determine the alcoholic content of blood, is hereby adopted and incorporated in its entirety into this chapter as if it were fully set forth herein.

Section 3. That this ordinance shall become effective upon the date and at the time of its final passage.
