

RESOLUTION NO. 5

WHEREAS, on May 27, 1969 the City Council of Alexandria, Virginia established by resolution an eleven member citizens advisory committee known as the Bi-Centennial Committee, the purpose of which is to cooperate with similar regional, state and national groups and to prepare recommendations for City Council regarding appropriate ceremonies, affairs and observances to be held in the City of Alexandria in recognition of the 200th anniversary of the independence of the United States of America; and

WHEREAS, on December 10, 1969 the City Council increased, by resolution, the number of citizen members on said Committee to twelve; and


WHEREAS, the City Council is of the opinion that the citizen membership on said Committee should be further increased to thirteen in number, one of which shall belong to a patriotic organization;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALEXANDRIA, VIRGINIA:

That the fifth paragraph of the Council resolution of May 27, 1969, amended on December 10, 1969, be further amended to read as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Members of City Council of Alexandria, Virginia, that there is hereby established * a thirteen member citizens (one of which shall belong to a patriotic organization) advisory committee to be known as the Bi-Centennial Committee whose purpose shall be to cooperate with similar regional, state and national groups and in the preparation of recommendations to City Council for appropriate ceremonies, affairs and observances to be held in the City of Alexandria in recognition of the bi-centennial anniversary of the independence of the United States of America, with the addition of the Mayor and Members of City Council as Ex-officio members of this Committee.
