

RESOLUTION NO. 83

WHEREAS, the Alexandria Redevelopment and Housing Authority under the direction of the City Council of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, is carrying out the Dip Urban Renewal Project, Va. R-64; and

WHEREAS, the Authority made application to the Department of Housing and Urban Development for loan and capital grant funds for the Project, and pursuant to such application, entered into a loan and grant contract with the Department of Housing and Urban Development for Federal financial assistance under Title I of the Housing Act of 1949, as amended, for the purpose of carrying out the Project; and

WHEREAS, prerequisite to said loan and grant contract, the Department of Housing and Urban Development required and received assurance of cooperation on the part of the City Council that local grants-in-aid would be provided equal to not less than one-fourth of the net cost of the project; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Housing and Urban Development entered terms into said loan and grant contract subsequently offered to the Authority, which, pursuant to the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, and effective July 1, 1972, makes the increased limits includable for the first time in the net cost of the Project and thereby shareable by the City at considerable expense at a time of great financial difficulty at the local level; and

WHEREAS, under said Act, the same terms would apply to any other federally assisted program subject to relocation requirements:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY
COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALEXANDRIA, VIRGINIA,
AS FOLLOWS:

The Federal Government is hereby requested to rescind its new requirement that the City share the expense of relocation payments for the Dip Urban Renewal Project, Va. R-64, as well as for any other federally assisted program subject to relocation requirements, and to continue itself to meet the total expense thereof.
