WHEREAS, the citizens of the City of Alexandria were saddened by the passing of Mr. Charles W. Hendryx on Monday, December 20, 1971; and

WHEREAS, Charles W. Hendryx was a devoted public servant, having served the community of Alexandria for more than 12 years in the position of Arborist and Parks Maintenance Superintendent; and

WHEREAS, Charles W. Hendryx did much to enhance the beauty and charm of the City of Alexandria through his dedicated and knowledgeable work in the field of horticulture; and

WHEREAS, he also served with distinction in his own special field as Landscape Superintendent at both the University of Virginia and at the Monticello Memorial Home of Thomas Jefferson prior to coming to Alexandria in 1959; and

WHEREAS, he was well acquainted with persons of national stature at Colonial Williamsburg and in national organizations devoted to the advancement of better landscaping, parks, shade tree cultivation and gardening; and

WHEREAS, he served his country well during World War II as a member of the United States Army Air Corps;
