WHEREAS, Clyde K. Warren had devoted a good portion of his life to public service in the interest of the community; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Warren had served with distinction as a member of the Alexandria City Traffic and Parking Board and was immediate past President of the Alexandria "Host" Lions-Club; and

WHEREAS, he gave much of his time and talent in serving as a member of the corporation of the Alexandria Hospital and as a member of the advisory boards of the Salvation Army, the American Legion, and the Alexandria Sportsman Club; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Warren contributed much to the community by founding and operating the Downtown Garage in Alexandria;
