

RESOLUTION NO. 128

WHEREAS, the City of Alexandria experienced severe flooding on the evening of June 21, 1972; and

WHEREAS, hundreds of Alexandrians' homes and belongings were damaged or destroyed; and

WHEREAS, many of the affected families could not afford to replace the lost items; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Joseph Guiffre, a public minded citizen who has served his city and his fellow Alexandrians on many past occasions, once again assumed a leadership role in organizing a furniture collection and distribution drive for the flood victims which took place on June 30, 1972; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Guiffre was able to secure the necessary trucks, drivers and helpers to serve the needs of 66 families in the flood area,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, that the City Council express its sincere appreciation to Mr. Joseph Guiffre and those who assisted him in this outstanding civic effort, and that a copy of this Resolution be spread upon the minutes of this City Council meeting and, further, that a copy of this Resolution of Appreciation be forwarded to Mr. Joseph Guiffre.
