

RESOLUTION NO. 138

WHEREAS, some citizens, the press, and members of City Council have noted Council's growing workload and therefore have advocated providing additional staff support and other forms of assistance to the Mayor and members of Council, and

WHEREAS, Council wishes to have the benefit of an objective review of the problem by concerned citizens.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of Alexandria, Virginia, that an ad hoc citizens committee composed of five residents of the City be, and hereby is, created to study means of improving Council's capacity to do its work. The study shall include a review of Council's workload, organization, meeting schedule, conditions, and procedures, staff needs and related matters. The Committee is requested to complete its work and report its findings and recommendations to Council by January 31, 1973. The Committee is further requested to project the annual cost of implementing its recommendations.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Council will appoint members of the Committee at its first regular meeting in October, that the Mayor will designate the chairman from among the appointees, and that the City Manager will provide such assistance as the committee may require.
