

RESOLUTION NO. 141

WHEREAS, Section 703 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1965 provides for the making of grants by the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development to local public bodies to assist them in financing the eligible development costs of neighborhood facilities for accommodating programs of community services; and

WHEREAS, the City of Alexandria (herein sometimes referred to as "Applicant") desires to develop a neighborhood facility on the block bordered by No. Alfred, Wythe, No. Patrick and Madison Streets; and

WHEREAS, Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and the regulations of the Department of Housing and Urban Development effectuating that title, provide that no person shall be discriminated against because of race, color, or national origin in the use of the land acquired and/or developed; and

WHEREAS, it is recognized that the contract for Federal grant will impose certain obligations and responsibilities upon the Applicant and will require among other things; (1) assurances that families and individuals displaced as a result of this project are offered decent, safe, and sanitary housing, and (2) compliance with Federal Labor standards, and (3) compliance with Federal requirements relating to equal employment opportunity, and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that the total cost of developing the neighborhood facility is \$375,000

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY
COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALEXANDRIA, VIRGINIA

1. That an application be made to the Department of Housing and Urban Development for a grant in an amount authorized by Section 703 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1965, which amount is presently estimated to be \$250,000, and that the Applicant will pay the balance of the cost from other funds available to it.
2. That the City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to execute and to file such application with the Department of Housing and Urban Development, to provide additional information and to furnish such documents as may be required by said Department, to execute such contracts as are required by said Department and to act as the authorized correspondent of the Applicant.
3. That the United States of America and the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development be, and they hereby are, assured of full compliance by the Applicant with regulations of the Department of Housing and Urban Development effectuating Title VI of the Civic Rights Act of 1964.
4. That the United States of America and the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development be, and they hereby are, assured of full compliance by the Applicant with the Federal Labor Standards imposed under Title VII of the Housing Act of 1961, as amended.
5. The City Clerk is authorized and directed to execute the "CERTIFICATE OF RECORDING OFFICER" attached, and to affix the official City Seal thereon and George E. Hubler, Jr., Budget Director, is authorized and directed to attest same.
