

RESOLUTION NO. 360

WHEREAS, the Alexandria City Council herein supports a Traffic Signalization System Utilizing Three Computers for Northern Virginia; and

WHEREAS, implementation of computerized traffic signalization in Northern Virginia would make commuting by bus and automobile faster, safer, and less damaging to the environment, while conserving energy resources; and

WHEREAS, the benefits of a computerized traffic signalization system can be attained with the coordinated use of three jurisdiction-based computers, which would also provide local control of traffic signalization; and

WHEREAS, the economic, environmental and social benefits attainable through computerized traffic signalization are of sufficient importance to merit concurrent moves by the local jurisdictions to develop a coordinated program as expeditiously as possible.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Alexandria City Council in an official meeting on December 10, 1974, hereby endorses a computerized traffic signalization system consisting of jurisdiction-based computers in the City of Alexandria, County of Arlington and the County of Fairfax to include the Cities of Fairfax and Falls Church.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Alexandria City Council endorses the concept with funding for the planning specifications and estimates phase of the coordinated traffic signalization program, subject to the conditions that the contract for design provide both implementation costs and benefits for each sub-system within the City of Alexandria.
