

WHEREAS, on June 27, 1974, the City Council of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, created a Transportation Planning Board to advise City Council on various long range and short range transportation plans; and

WHEREAS, the Transportation Planning Board has recommended and the City Council desires to make certain changes in the functions of the Board.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, that the resolution of June 27, 1974, be and hereby is amended as follows:

. . . . (T)he Board shall adopt its own rules of procedures, provided they are consistent with this Resolution and all applicable codes of the City of Alexandria and the Commonwealth of Virginia. The Transportation Planning Board is authorized to hold public hearings, on its own or in conjunction with other City Boards or Commissions, as it deems necessary and appropriate to carry out its assigned responsibilities.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the duties of the Board shall be to advise the City Council, the Planning Commission, the Traffic and Parking Board, the Planning Advisory Committee, and other appropriate city boards and commissions on:

1. The development of a long range unified transportation plan for the City of Alexandria.
2. The development of short-range transportation improvements and improvements in the transportation planning process, including recommendations to the City Council and the City Manager on ways of reducing gaps, overlaps and conflicts among city boards, commissions, and agencies that have transportation related responsibilities.
3. The level of Metro rail and bus fares.
4. Bus routes, schedules, and stops.
5. Bus stop shelter locations and designs.
6. Metro station design changes, which can be expected to affect access to or egress from the station, or vehicular and pedestrian circulation on or in the vicinity of the station site.
7. Such highway, road, and bridge improvements as may be referred to the Board by the City Council.
8. Such other matters relating to transportation planning as the City Council may refer to the Board, or the Board, on its own initiative, may choose to consider.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Manager and the City Attorney and their staffs shall provide assistance to the Board.
