WHEREAS, Mr. Reichmann had a long and rich career as an exceptionally talented journalist; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Reichmann spent the last thirty years of his life as a resident of the City of Alexandria; and

WHEREAS, among his numerous national and international journalistic endeavors, he is most well known to this City Council as a public affairs editor and city government porter for the Alexandria Gazette, a position he held for fifteen years; and

WHEREAS, while Mr. Reichmann was a strong and persevering reporter, he constantly maintained a high degree of professional standards and ethics; and

WHEREAS, until his retirement in 1972, Mr. Reichmann continued to contribute to the pages of the Alexandria Gazette on matters of local, national and international interest,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Alexandria, Virginia hereby expresses its sincere sympathy to Mr. John A. Reichmann's wife, Jean, and to his family.
