

RESOLUTION NO. 534

WHEREAS, the Alexandria Chamber of Commerce wishes that visitors to the City of Alexandria entering via 14th Street Bridge, and Interstate-95 South be directed into the downtown area via the most attractive route; and

WHEREAS, the George Washington Parkway is a more pleasant approach into the City from Route I-95 South.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, that the City Council hereby endorses and supports the proposal of the Alexandria Chamber of Commerce to direct visitors to our city via the most attractive entrance and herein requests the Virginia Department of Highways and Transportation to pursue such signing changes as requested by the Chamber of Commerce as outlined in their January 17, 1977 letter to the City Manager. The City Council further obligates the City of Alexandria to reimburse the Virginia Department of Highways and Transportation for costs incurred in modifying the directional signs in an amount not to exceed \$325.00 of the actual cost estimate provided by the Virginia Department of Highways and Transportation. If the actual cost exceeds \$325.00, Council will then reconsider the entire proposal unless the Alexandria Chamber of Commerce agrees to compensate the State for the excess cost.
