

## ORDINANCE NO. 127

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 36, OF THE CITY OF ALEXANDRIA, VIRGINIA, APPROVED FEBRUARY 19th, 1925, BEING AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE REGULATIONS FOR THE KEEPING OF DOGS WITHIN THE CITY OF ALEXANDRIA.**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALEXANDRIA, VIRGINIA:**

Section 1.—That Sections 2 and 3 of Ordinance No. 36 of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, approved February 19, 1925, be repealed and re-enacted to read as follows:

“Section 2.—Whenever in the opinion of the Public Health Officer of the City it is advisable and necessary for the public health and safety, and notice thereof is published in the Alexandria Gazette, all dogs when off the premises of the owner shall be effectively muzzled, unless accompanied by the owner or his agent and under leash. All unlicensed dogs will be impounded by and kept in charge of such employee or employees of the City as may be designated by the City Manager.

“Section 3.—The owner of any dog caught and impounded shall be entitled to the possession of such animal upon proof of ownership and payment to the City of Alexandria of the sum of \$1.00; provided that if the dog has not been innoculated against rabies, the provision of this Ordinance relative to innoculation must be complied with and, provided further, if the dog is not licensed, a license must be procured. Any and all dogs which have been impounded and are not redeemed within one week after impounding will be destroyed, or otherwise disposed of.”

Section 2.—This Ordinance shall become effective on the day following its publication in the Alexandria Gazette.
