

## ORDINANCE No. 131

AN ORDINANCE to amend Ordinance No. 109 of the Council of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, approved July 25th, 1931, being an Ordinance entitled: "An Ordinance to regulate and restrict the location of buildings and structures and of premises to be used for trade, industry, residence or other specified uses within the City of Alexandria; to divide the City into zones, and to impose in each of said zones regulations designating the kinds or classes of trades, industries, residences or other purposes for which buildings or other structures or premises may be erected, altered or used; and to regulate the height, bulk and location of buildings and other structures and the areas of yards and open spaces," as amended.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALEXANDRIA, VIRGINIA:

Section 1. That the Zoning Map described and referred to in Section 2 of Ordinance No. 109 of the Council of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, as amended be changed and amended in the following particulars, to-wit:

(a) That all of that square bounded by Madison, Montgomery, Pitt and Royal Streets and that portion of the square located at the intersection of the west side of Fairfax Street with the south side of Oronoco Street, having a frontage of 136 feet on each street be changed from the present classification of "A" Residence Zone to "E" Industrial Zone.

(b) That all of that portion of the southern one-half of the square bounded by DeWitt, Bellefonte, Mt. Vernon and Howell Avenues now classified as "A" Residence zone be changed to "B" Residence zone.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its passage.
