

ORDINANCE NO. 157

An Ordinance to repeal and re-enact sub-paragraph No. 2 of Section 1 of Ordinance No. 48 of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, approved February 4, 1926, entitled

"An ordinance to regulate and provide for the dedication, opening and acceptance of streets, avenues, lanes, alleys and public ways, and the construction of sewers and drains, in subdivisions of land in the City of Alexandria, Virginia, and providing penalties for failure to comply."

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Alexandria, Virginia:

Section 1. That sub-paragraph No. 2 of Section 1 of Ordinance No. 48 of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, approved February 4, 1926, be repealed and re-enacted to read as follows:

No. 2—Said streets and avenues must be at least fifty feet in width between property lines and thirty feet in width between curb lines; said alleys at least ten feet in width; grades and gradients to be established by the approval of the City Engineer.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage.
