

ORDINANCE NO. 195

AN ORDINANCE to temporarily permit private property owners on Franklin Street from Lee Street to Patrick Street to park or enclose by hedges or fences from the lot line to a point thirty-four feet from the center line of Franklin Street.

WHEREAS Franklin Street is one hundred feet wide from the lot line to lot line, and

WHEREAS a forty-foot roadway between curb lines now established is sufficient to meet the present needs of this thoroughfare, and

WHEREAS it is deemed desirable for the most advantageous use and appearance of said Franklin Street that the private property owners abutting thereon be permitted to park or enclose that portion of Franklin Street from the lot lines to a point thirty-four feet from center line of said street temporarily until the public needs may require a larger area of said street for public purposes,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Alexandria, Virginia:

SECTION 1. That the City Manager be and he is hereby authorized upon request from any property owner whose lands abut upon Franklin Street between Lee Street and Patrick Street to issue to said property owner a permit to park or enclose by hedges or fences that portion of Franklin Street in front of the property of said owner extending from the lot line to a point thirty-four feet from the center line of Franklin Street, said permit, however, to be subject to revocation whenever, in the opinion of the Council, the public needs require it. No fences shall be erected under the provisions of this ordinance—except light wooden pickets or light iron nor—at a height exceeding three feet nor shall any hedge or other enclosure be permitted to extend to a height exceeding three feet, and all construction shall be under the supervision of the City Engineer.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage.
