

ORDINANCE NO. 39

An ordinance directing the Washington-Virginia Railway Company to take up its track now laid on Cameron Street from the West side of Columbus Street to the East side of West Street and to lay new ties and new rails of approved pattern and to grade and pave the space between said rails and two feet on each side thereof with an approved pavement on a concrete base.

Whereas, the City Council of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, has determined to have Cameron Street from the west side of Columbus Street to the east side of West Street graded and paved with bituminous macadam paving on a six inch concrete base or the present cobblestone base as the case may be; and

Whereas, the tracks of the Washington-Virginia Railway Company occupy a portion of the said street as above described, therefore,

Be It Ordained by the City Council of the City of Alexandria, Virginia:

Section 1. That the said Washington-Virginia Railway Company is hereby directed and required to take up the rails and ties now laid on said street as above described within ninety days after notification from the City Manager and to rebuild said road bed with ties and rails of design approved by the City Manager and to have the space between said rails and two feet on each side thereof graded and paved with a pavement approved by the City Manager on a six inch concrete base, said grading and paving to be done at the same time the rest of the street above described is being graded and paved by the City, said work to be done under the supervision of the City Engineer.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage.
