

## ORDINANCE NO. 240

**ON ORDINANCE to regulate and restrict the sale and use of fireworks in the City of Alexandria, Virginia.**

**Be It Ordained by the Council of the City of Alexandria, Virginia:**

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful to sell in the City of Alexandria, Virginia, any fireworks, except on July 3rd, 4th and 5th of 1937, and the sale or use of sky rockets, roman candles, torpedoes, dynamite torpedoes, dynamite caps, or fire crackers exceeding two inches in length shall be unlawful at any time. On and after July 6, 1937, the sale or use of any form of fireworks in the City of Alexandria is prohibited.

Section 2. That the use and/or explosion of any fireworks authorized to be sold in the City of Alexandria is prohibited except on the 5th day of July, 1937, and in no instance shall any such fireworks be used or exploded on King Street, between Union Street and Russell Road, on Washington Street, between Jefferson Street and First Street, on Duke Street between St. Asaph and Alfred Streets, and on Columbus Street between Prince and Wolfe Streets.

Section 3. Any violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of not less than Two Dollars nor more than One Hundred Dollars.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect on June 10th, 1937. Approved this 8th day of June, 1937.
