

ORDINANCE NO. 275

AN ORDINANCE to repeal and re-enact Section 7 of an Ordinance of the City of Alexandria, Virginia passed the 27th day of August, 1918, and approved the 30th day of August, 1918, entitled "An Ordinance providing for the disposal of human excreta; declaring insanitary privies a nuisance; providing for the method of installing sanitary privies, providing for the construction, use and maintenance of the same; fixing charges for scavenger service; fixing the penalty for the violation of the provisions of this Ordinance; and repealing other Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict hereto."

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Alexandria, Virginia:

Section 1. That Section 7 of an Ordinance of the City of Alexandria, Virginia passed the 27th day of August, 1918 and approved the 30th day of August, 1918, providing for the installation of sanitary privies and for the operation of a scavenger service be repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

"Section 7. That the City Council shall provide for the operation of an adequate scavenger service to secure a sanitary collection, removal and disposal of the contents of all privy receptacles at least once each week; that there shall be a charge of One Dollar and Fifty Cents (\$1.50) for cleaning each privy and an additional charge of Twenty-Five Cents (\$.25) for cleaning each receptacle, in addition to one, contained in any privy; that all the said charges shall be payable quarterly in advance, shall be charges against the owner of the premises, and shall constitute a lien upon the premises from the time of default."

Section 2. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect on and after February 1, 1939.
