

ORDINANCE NO. 333

AN ORDINANCE to amend the communicable diseases law of the City of Alexandria, Virginia by repealing and re-enacting Section 7 of Chapter 16 of the Alexandria City Code.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALEXANDRIA, VIRGINIA:

Section 1. That Section 7 of Chapter 16 of Alexandria City Code be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

"Sec. 7. Certificates of freedom from disease to be furnished by dispensers of food and drink; dairy employees, etc.

All persons employed in any hotel, restaurant, beer parlor, boarding house, store, club, school, beauty parlor, dairy, or other place where food or drink is dispensed publicly or where the public may be exposed to disease, shall supply to the health department every twelve months a certificate signed by a reputable physician stating that they are either free from infections, contagious, or communicable diseases including tuberculosis and venereal diseases, or incapable of communicating any of such diseases to others, and specifying the laboratory and clinical diagnoses upon which the certificate is issued; and shall supply to the Health Department once every twelve months an x-ray report signed by a recognized radiologist or specialist in diseases of the chest. All persons hereafter beginning employment in any one of the capacities above mentioned shall submit to the Health Department certificate and report as above required within thirty days of the commencement of such employment.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall take effect on the day after its publication in the Alexandria Gazette.
