

ORDINANCE NO. 380

AN ORDINANCE to amend the milk law of the City of Alexandria, Virginia by repealing and re-enacting Section 7 of Chapter XIX of the Alexandria City Code.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALEXANDRIA, VIRGINIA:

Section 1. That Section 7 of Chapter XIX of the Alexandria City Code, enacted as a whole July 2, 1940 and made effective August 5, 1940, be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

"Sec. 7. Pasteurized milk.

There shall be two grades of pasteurized milk—namely, grade "A" and grade "B".

Grade "A" pasteurized milk shall answer the same requirements as to constituent parts as raw milk, and shall have a bacterial count of not over 50,000 organisms per cubic centimeter before pasteurization, and not over 25,000 organisms per cubic centimeter when delivered to the consumer.

Grade "B" pasteurized milk shall answer the same requirements as to constituent parts as raw milk and shall have a bacterial count of not over 100,000 organisms per cubic centimeter before pasteurization and not over 25,000 organisms per cubic centimeter when delivered to the consumer.

All pasteurized milk shall be capped with caps showing the name of dealer."

Section 2. That this ordinance shall take effect on the day after its publication in The Alexandria Gazette.
