

ORDINANCE NO. 412

AN ORDINANCE to amend Chapter 266 of the Code of Alexandria, Virginia, enacted as a whole July 2, 1940, and made effective August 5, 1940.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALEXANDRIA, VIRGINIA:

Section 1. That Chapter 26 of the Code of Alexandria be amended by repealing and re-enacting Section 9 and by adding Section 9-A to read as follows:

Section 9. To whom "Certificate A" issued.

(a) "Certificate A" shall be issued to any person about to engage in the business of master electrician who has passed the required examination before the electrical board. The certificate shall specify the name of the person, firm or corporation receiving it; and if the certificate is issued to a firm or corporation, the name of the person representing such firm or corporation shall also be specified.

(b) A firm or corporation may receive a "Certificate A" provided a bona fide member, officer or authorized agent thereof passes the required examination; but all electrical work done by any such firm or corporation shall be executed by or be under the immediate supervision of such qualified member, officer or agent. In the event the representative sever his association with or employment by such firm or corporation, the certificate shall immediately become void.

(c) No "Certificate A" shall be issued until the proposed recipient shall have obtained the required city and state contractor's license from the commissioner of revenue.

Section 9-A. Qualifications of applicants for "Certificate A."

Applications for examination for "Certificate A" shall be at least twenty-one years of age. They shall be examined on their knowledge of the trade of electricians, their knowledge of regulations governing electrical work in the City of Alexandria, their ability to lay out and supervise electrical work, and they shall demonstrate to the board their fitness to properly and intelligently carry on the business of master electrician. An applicant shall make written application for examination; and in case of failure, he shall be eligible for re-examination sixty days after failure. If he

fails such re-examination, he shall be ineligible for further examination until a lapse of six months.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall take effect on January 1, 1944.
