

ORDINANCE NO. 440

AN ORDINANCE to amend Section 3, Chapter 28, of the Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, enacted as a whole July 2, 1940 and made effective August 5, 1940, relating to location and boundaries of zones.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALEXANDRIA, VIRGINIA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the "Revised Zoning Map" described and referred to in Section 3, of Chapter 28, of the Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia enacted as a whole July 2, 1940 and made effective August 5, 1940, be and the same is hereby amended in the particulars following so that the pieces of property hereinafter listed are changed to the respective zones specified:

- (1) Lots 1, 2 and 3, Block 1 and Lots 1, 2 and 3, Block 3, Section 1, Glenmore Subdivision (property located at the intersection of Moncure Drive and Duke Street) to D-2 Commercial.
- (2) Lot 7, Block 1, Map 101-A, located at the southwest corner of Duke and Elizabeth Streets to D-2 commercial.
- (3) Lots 31 and 32, Block 4, Map 202, located on the north side of Walnut Street between Commonwealth Avenue and Marsteller Street having a depth of 100 feet, Lot 1 and part of Lot 31, Block 3, Map 202, located at southeast corner of Walnut Street and Commonwealth Avenue having a frontage of 74.5 feet on Walnut Street, 110 feet on Commonwealth Avenue. Rear property line parallel to Walnut Street has a length of 96.16 feet to D-2 commercial.
- (4) Lots 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5, Block 4, Map 135, also known as 600 South Washington Street and 610, 610½, 612 and 614 Gibbon Street to D-2 commercial.
- (5) Part of Lots 10, 11, 13 and 13-A, Block 4, Map 214, being a strip of ground 150 feet east of and parallel with Mt. Vernon Avenue, and having frontage of 50 feet on Bruce Street and depth of 437 feet to D-2 commercial.
- (6) 1002 Prince Street (Lot 9, Block 7, Map 119) south side of Prince Street 15 feet 0 minutes west of Patrick Street to D-2 commercial.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall become effective immediately after its publication in the Alexandria Gazette.
