

Ordinance No. 511

An Ordinance to vacate and close as public streets all of South Street lying East of Washington Street and West of Royal Street, St. Asaph Street, south of South Street to Hunting Creek, Pitt Street south of South Street to Hunting Creek, Hunting Place (Park Street) East of Washington Street and Mount Vernon Avenue from Washington Street to Royal Street, in the City of Alexandria, Virginia.

Whereas, those thoroughfares known as South Street lying between Washington Street and Royal Street, St. Asaph Street from South Street to Hunting Creek, Pitt Street from South Street to Hunting Creek, Hunting Place (Park Street) east of Washington Street and Mount Vernon Avenue from Washington Street to Royal Street have never been opened as public highways, and whereas it appearing that the City will never have use for them as public highways and that it is equitable and just from the view points of the public and the owners of the property adjoining said thoroughfares to vacate and abandon the same;

Therefore, be it ordained by the Council of the City of Alexandria, Virginia;

Section One: That all of those thoroughfares known as South Street lying between Washington and Royal Streets, St. Asaph Street, south of South Street to Hunting Creek, Pitt Street, south of South Street to Hunting Creek, Hunting Place (Park Street) East of Washington Street, and Mount Vernon Avenue between Washington and Royal Streets, in the City of Alexandria, be and the same are hereby vacated and closed as public streets and thoroughfares.

Section Two: That this ordinance shall take effect only upon the delivery and recording of a good and sufficient deed approved by the City Attorney granting to the City of Alexandria an easement 25 feet wide for all kinds of sewer use with full incidental rights of ingress and egress for construction, maintenance and repair thereof, running along the shore line of Hunting Creek from Royal Street to Washington Street.

Section Three: That this ordinance be recorded among the Land Records of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, appropriately indexed in the name of the City of Alexandria, and the Streets affected thereby. October 14, 1947
