

Ordinance No. 519

AN ORDINANCE Vacating a portion of North Royal Street, a portion of Madison Street and of North Fairfax Street, being public Streets of the City of Alexandria, Virginia.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALEXANDRIA, VIRGINIA:

Section 1. That all of the following described portion of North Fairfax Street, one of the public streets of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, be and the same hereby is vacated and abandoned as a public street and thoroughfare, to-wit:

Beginning at the intersection of the north line of Madison Street with the west side of Fairfax Street; thence north along the west line of Fairfax Street 101 feet to a point; thence south along the east face of a brick building 51.50 feet to a point, said point being 0.07 feet east of the west line of Fairfax Street; thence continuing with the east face of said brick building 49.50 feet to a point opposite the north line of Madison Street projected; thence along the south face of the wall of said brick building 0.02 feet to the point of beginning.

Section 2. That all of the following described portions of Madison Street and North Royal Street, public streets of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, be and the same hereby are vacated and abandoned as public streets and thoroughfares, to-wit:

Beginning at the intersection of the north line of Madison Street with the west line of Fairfax Street; thence along the south face of a brick building 246.86 feet to the west line of said building, said point being 0.09 feet south of the north line of Madison Street and 0.03 feet west of the east line of Royal Street; thence with the west face of said brick building 49.59 feet to a point in the east line of Royal Street; thence south with the east line of Royal Street 49.50 to the north line of Madison Street; thence with the north line of Madison Street 246.83 feet to the point of beginning.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect on the day following its publication in the Alexandria Gazette.
