

## Ordinance No. 658

AN ORDINANCE to amend and reordain Sec. 1, Chapter XXIII-A of the Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia enacted as a whole July 2, 1940 and made effective August 5, 1940, as said chapter was enacted by Ordinance No. 349, which said chapter relates to the throwing or depositing of refuse, trash, garbage etc., upon public highways and spaces and private lots and premises and imposes penalties, and which said section thereof relates to the throwing or depositing of refuse, building materials etc., upon public highways and spaces and the burning of fires on such places.

### THE CITY COUNCIL OF ALEXANDRIA HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That Sec. 1, Chapter XXIII-A of the Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia enacted as a whole July 2, 1940 and made effective August 5, 1940, be, and the same hereby is amended and re-ordained to read as follows:

Sec. 1. No person shall throw, cast, deposit, drop, scatter, or leave, or cause to be thrown, cast, laid, deposited, scattered or left, in or upon any street, avenue, alley, highway, sidewalk, parking or other public space in the City of Alexandria, Virginia, any coal, dirt, mud, ashes, gravel, sand, sawdust, shavings, hay, straw, offal, vegetable matter, garbage, trees, cinders, paper or refuse matter of any kind, any dead animal or putrescible matter of any sort, or building material of any kind.

In the case where it is very difficult or impossible to get building materials to a premises without depositing the same on some public space, a permit shall be obtained from the City Manager and notice shall be given the police department.

No person shall kindle or set on fire any combustible material on any paved sidewalk, gutter or roadway.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall be published in the Alexandria Gazette not later than two days following its introduction together with a notice containing the time and place for a public hearing. The clerk of the council shall note the date of introduction and first reading, the date of publication, the date of the public hearing, and the date of the second reading and final passage in the minutes of the meeting. This ordinance shall become effective the date of its final passage.
