

Ordinance No. 669

AN ORDINANCE to vacate a street 25 feet in width, said street being hereinafter more particularly described, one of the public streets of the City of Alexandria, Virginia.

WHEREAS, acting pursuant to the laws provided for in such cases, it is the opinion of the Council of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, that the hereinafter described street is not needed for public use and whereas it is in the public interest to vacate same,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF ALEXANDRIA HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That the following described street in the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 25 feet in width, be and the same hereby is vacated, closed and abandoned as a public street and thoroughfare:

Beginning at a point in the west line of Summit Avenue, said point being the northeast corner of Villa Site 20, South Braddock Heights; thence with the north line of said Villa Site 20, and continuing with the north line of Villa Site 21, S. 87° 35' 20" W. 398.90 ft., to a point; thence N. 2° 24' 40" W. 25.00 ft., to a point in the original north boundary line of South Braddock Heights; thence with said boundary line N. 87° 35' 20" E. 393.25 ft., to a point in the west line of Braddock Road; thence with west line of Braddock Road S 33° 24' 45" E. 12.36 ft., to a point in the west line of Summit Avenue; thence with the line of Summit Avenue along the arc of a curve to the left 14:43 ft. (radius 140.00 ft. chord S. 00° 25' 57" W. 14.22 ft.) to the point of beginning, containing 0.2284 acres.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall be published in the Alexandria Gazette not later than two days following its introduction together with a notice containing the time and place for a public hearing. The clerk of the council shall note the date of introduction and first reading, the date of publication, the date of the public hearing, and the date of the second reading and final passage in the minutes of the meeting. This ordinance shall become effective the date of its final passage.
